29<sup>TH</sup> SEPTEMBER, 2024



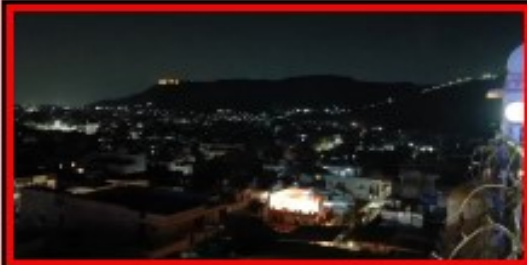

**CLASS: 01<sup>ST</sup> - 12<sup>TH</sup>**



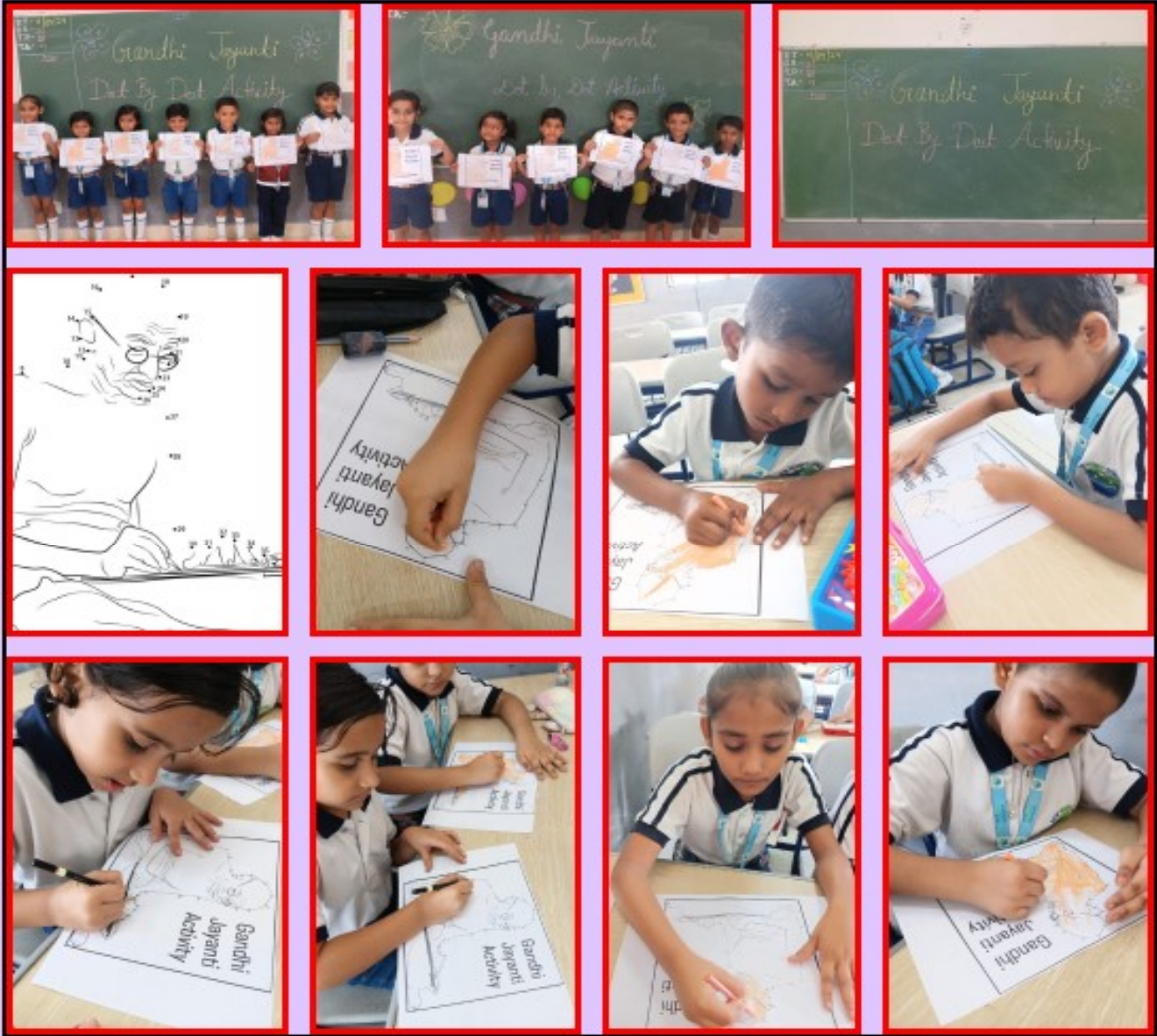

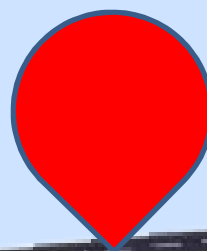

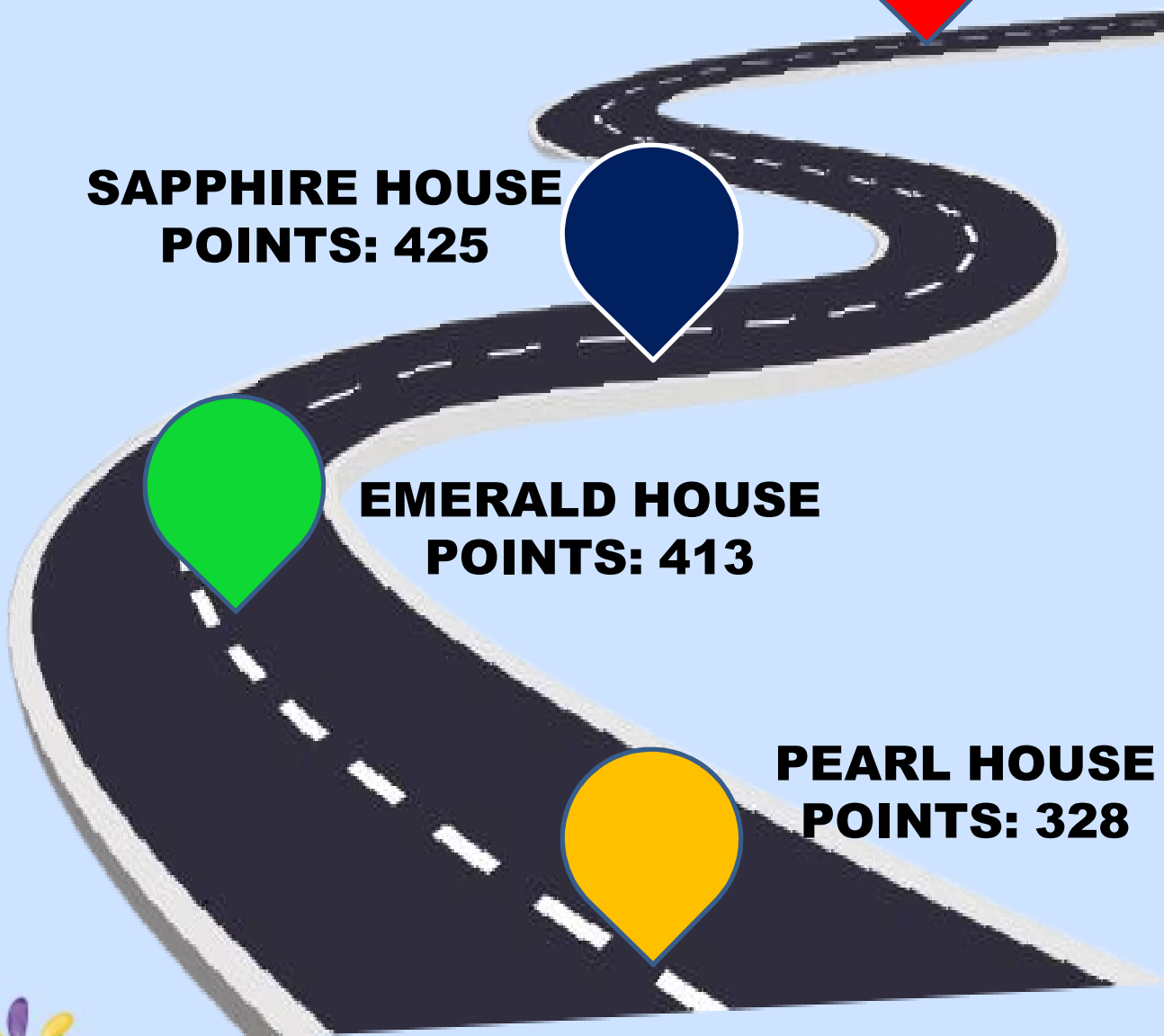

# **DESK OF JOURNALISM**

## ***PREPARATIONS OF EXAMS & TIME MANAGEMENT :***

Effective time management is crucial, especially with board exams and pre-boards approaching. Start by creating a study schedule that covers all subjects, breaking the syllabus into manageable sections and assigning specific time slots for each topic. Prioritize tasks based on strengths and weaknesses, focusing on difficult subjects first. Set clear, achievable goals for each study session to stay motivated. Use time blocks, such as the Pomodoro Technique, studying for 25 minutes followed by a 5-minute break. Minimize distractions by studying in a quiet place and limiting phone use. Regularly review what you've learned to reinforce your knowledge. Ensure you stay healthy by getting enough sleep, eating well and incorporating relaxation or exercise. Finally, practice with past papers to familiarize yourself with the exam format. These strategies will help you manage your time effectively and approach your exams with confidence.

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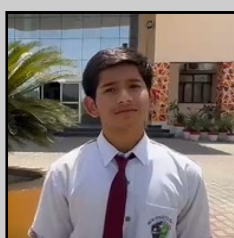
